THE FOUR CLASSES OF ASTROMOGY are :

- (I) GENETHLIACAL oe NATAL- the science of Nativities. (this is the branch which is concerned with "casting a person's horoscope)
- (2) HORARY a form of divination for the answering of questions of temperary interest.
- (3) MUNDANE dealing with the public affairs of nations
- (4) METEOROLOGICAL > Weather predicating.
- (5) (note some writers now add a fifth class- MEDICAL- the astrologfor treatment -imal diagnosis and indications of disease. The value of such a investigations mat be considered as stillunproved)

The Order is concerned mainly with the first two classes. THE STUDENT SHOULD ALWAYS REMEMBER HOWEVER THAT ASTROGOLY IS NOT FATALISTIC. A horoscope merely shows the influences at work at a particular time and lpace and enables the astrogologer to predict that, if no steps are taken to cheek or stimulate those influences. the native will dislpay such and such characteristic, or that such and such are likely to fellow.

## 2. DEFINATIONS

The Zediac is a belt of the heavens, extending about eight degrees on either side of the ECLIPTIC (qv), and divided into twelve equal SIGNS named after twelve constellations. At one time the signs and Constellations correspond in position, but owing to the progress known as Precession of the Equinoxes (far to complicated for explanation here) they no longer do so. It is with the signs that Astrology is concerned. All the metions of the Solar System are
